

REGULAR MEETING

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall on Tuesday May 21, 1963, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P. M.) in regular session with Mayor Mary Alice Dunlap presiding.

Members Present: Chitwood, Peace, Pearson, Faucett, Hickman, and Shertzer, Sikes.

Members Absent: None

The meeting was opened with roll call of the members present.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett, that the minutes of the regular meeting of May 7, 1963, be approved; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes presented Appropriation Ordinance Number 2, 1963, for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

The Clerk-Treasurer read Appropriation Ordinance Number 2, 1963.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that Appropriation Ordinance Number 2, 1963, be advanced to second reading and read by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer. Upon a roll call vote, the motion was unanimously carried.

Ordinance

The Clerk-Treasurer read, by title only, Appropriation/Number 2, 1963.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Peace, that Appropriation Ordinance Number 2, 1963, be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote, the motion was unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes presented RESolution Number 14, 1963, for reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

RESOLUTION # 14, May 21, 1963

Common Council of Bloomington, Indiana

WHEREAS, Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Bloomington has submitted an Agreement, approved by it on 13th of May, 1963, for certain engineering work to be performed by Consoer, Townsend & Associates in connection with the relocation of the Sare Road Lift Station at Winston Road and the Creek, the extension of a gravity sewer from the present Sare Road Lift Station south in the Creek Valley to the new lift station, the construction of a new lift station and a force main to the high ground to the west on Winslow Road, and a gravity sewer to the west to the present 39" interceptor and a connection thereto with manholes and appurtenances on property owned or to be acquired by purchase or lease by the City.

WHEREAS, such work is reasonable and necessary in connection with the Sare Lift Station Project currently undertaken jointly by the City of Bloomington and the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Public Health Service, of the Federal Government.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Common Council hereby approves, ratifies and adopts the Agreement theretofore entered into by the Board of Public Works and Safety for certain engineering work to be performed in connection with the Sare Lift Station Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Public Works and Safety be, and hereby is, directed to proceed and act by and under the terms of said Agreement.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Council Chitwood, that Resolution Number 14, 1963, be duly adopted; motion unanimously carried.

Mrs. Voigtschild, 415 East 6th Street, asked the Council that the alley bordering her property on the West not be vacated from the East/West alley South to Sixth.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that the Common Council not oppose the vacation of one-half block of the alley between Grant and Dunn and North of the East/West alley between Grant and Dunn to East 7th Street; motion unanimously carried.

A request from the Bloomington Metropolitan Schools for annexation of the new Bloomington High School property was read by the Clerk-Treasurer and placed on file in his office.

Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Sikes, that the request from the Bloomington Metropolitan Schools be referred to the City Attorney for preparation of an ordinance to be presented to the Council; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Peace presented the following report from the Bloomington Traffic Commission.

BLOOMINGTON TRAFFIC COMMISSION

TO: The Mayor and the Common Council of Bloomington, Indiana

At the May 14, 1963 meeting of the Bloomington Traffic Commission, below listed traffic and related recommendations were adopted and are herewith submitted to the Mayor and the Common Council for consideration and action.

1. Recommends that a Resolution go to the the State Highway Department requesting 2-hr. parking be established on the west side of Walnut street from 9th to 10th street.
2. Recommends that a Resolution go to the State Highway Department requesting the establishment of two 15-minute parking spaces at 1110 on north College Avenue.
3. Recommends the elimination of parking on the north side of Hillside between Rogers street and Madison.
4. Recommends that the yellow curb be extended for a distance of 18 feet on 10th street at the intersections of Grant and Lincoln.

The Clerk-Treasurer read the following report from the Monroe County Medical Society.

TO: MONROE COUNTY COMMISSIONER

The Monroe County Medical Society passed the following resolutions at their regular meeting, April 25, 1963.

WHEREAS: The health of every individual is fundamental to his personal happiness, attainments and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS: The health and physical fitness of the citizens is essential to the security and prosperity of the community, state and nation; and

WHEREAS: The establishment of a full-time county health department is recognized as the most practical and economical way of securing health

services that are necessary; to offer maximum health protection to the people of any community; and

WHEREAS: Such full-time health departments offer more efficient and comprehensive health protection to the people through the services rendered by physicians, engineers, sanitarians, nurses, and other specialist who are trained and experienced in public health; and

WHEREAS: The establishment of full-time county health departments is endorsed by the Indiana State Board of Health, Indiana State Medical Association, American Medical Association and other official and voluntary health agencies, in Indiana; and

WHEREAS: Chapter 157, Acts of 1949, Indiana General Assembly, permits the establishment of full-time health departments; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Monroe County Medical Society approves the establishment for a full-time local health department in Monroe County, Indiana, and recommends that the County Commissioner take the necessary action to establish such a health department and the provision of necessary funds for its maintenance and operation.
